Successful ToT Program Energizes Galle City Dwellers for a Cleaner Community



Under the auspices of the Clean Cities Blue Ocean Program, funded by the United States Development Assistance, the initiative "Let Galle be a clean city" has made significant progress through the Garbage Management Cooperation Project. Additionally. Mr. Premaratne, Deputy Director of the Southern Province Central Environment Authority, and officers from the HELP-O task force lent their expertise to ensure the program's success.



The primary objective of the Training of Trainers program was to equip participants with the necessary knowledge and skills to effectively manage garbage within the Galle District. EMPOWERING COMMUNITIES FOR EFFECTIVE WASTE MANAGEMENT



In collaboration with the Ministry of Environment and supported by the Basel-Rotterdam and Stockholm Conventions, several impactful environmental conservation projects are underway in Sri Lanka. Notably, the "Galle is a plastic waste-free city" initiative, conducted in partnership with Japan's Goliya Environmental Strategy Institute (IGES) and funded by the Basel Rotterdam Secretariat (BRS), is progressing well. Launched in 2023 and set to conclude this year, the project is focused on reducing plastic waste through various measures such as school programs, video competitions, promoting alternative products, and monitoring recycling industries.

Additionally, the e-Sabha program has emerged as a highly effective tool for community engagement and governance. Developed as a mobile phone application, e-Sabha allows citizens to submit complaints and feedback to local authorities quickly and conveniently, saving time and resources. STRENGTHENING LOCAL RESILIENCE: INSIGHTS FROM THE SRI LANKA PREPAREDNESS PARTNERSHIP'S 2024 COUNTRY CONSULTATION WORKSHOP



On May 9–10, 2024, the Sri Lanka Preparedness Partnership (SLPP) held a Country Consultation Workshop. More than fifty people who represent national, international, and local organizations involved in disaster risk reduction in the nation attended.

Dr. Sisira Madurapperuma (Director, Preparedness for Response and Recovery Department, Asian Disaster Preparedness Center), emphasized that despite commitments from the 2016 World Humanitarian Summit and the Grand Bargain, direct international funding to local actors remains challenging, and the SI PP can help foster multi-sectoral collaboration for resilience building. Maj. Gen. (Ret.) Udaya Herath, Director General of the Disaster Management Center in Sri Lanka and Co-Chair of SLPP, emphasized the need to expand the partnership to the subnational level for equal and active local actor engagement. He highlighted that enhanced cooperation within SLPP will benefit the Sri Lankan people by building resilient communities, aligning with national sustainable development goals, and complementing government development efforts.

By means of interactive dialogues and exchange of knowledge, the attendees discerned tactics for anticipatory disaster readiness, with the objective of optimizing coordination among relevant parties, augmenting community involvement, and effectively utilizing assets to alleviate hazards and foster resilient communities throughout Sri Lanka.

The Disaster Management Center, Janathakshan GTE LTD (civil society), and the Ceylon Chamber of Commerce (private sector) co-chair the SLPP, the national of the Asian Preparedness chapter Partnership (APP) in Sri Lanka. APP was established in 2017 with funding from USAID BHA, the Bill & Melinda Gates Foundation, and the Asian Disaster Preparedness Center. Its mission is to lessen the effects of disasters on at-risk communities in Asia by promoting locally-led disaster risk management initiatives that create safer, better-prepared communities.


